COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Introduction to College Writing at Berklee College of Music

In this course, students explore the writing process as a tool of thinking and a mode of exploration. Students develop academic writing and expository prose techniques for creating clear and coherent papers. The course covers a wide range of skills necessary for college-level work including sentence-level issues, theses, paragraph structure, organization, form, and style. A focus will be placed on writing styles appropriate to audience and purpose. In addition, the process of writing and revision will be emphasized during the course. Students develop critical thinking skills and learn to evaluate, utilize, and cite primary and secondary printed and electronic sources. Students begin to cultivate a strong, individual, and creative voice by developing oral communication skills for a variety of settings.

Human Anatomy and Physiology at Berklee College of Music

This course covers basic knowledge of the structure and function of the human body. Each of the bodily systems will be dealt with as a separate entity, and then as an integrated part of the whole. This course is distinct from LMSC-221, Health and Wellness, in that it details more technical material for use in clinical settings at a level necessary to meet music therapy curricular competencies.

General Psychology at Berklee College of Music

This course is a survey of the history, theory, and applications of general psychology, including the study of human behavior, factors in psychological development, methods of measurement, and the brain.

<u>Data Management & Statistics at Berklee College of Music</u>

This course focuses on the development of quantitative, graphic, and verbal skills in the analysis of data, emphasising the ability to reduce data to its simplest and most representative expression, as necessary for music business operations. A focus of the course will be the familiarisation of the student with the economic statistics of the music industry in the United States and abroad. Additionally, students' communication skills are developed through effective, computer-enhanced data presentation.

LMSC-251, TBD

Introduction to College Writing at Emerson College

Introduces college writing, focusing on cultural analysis that appears in academic work and in the public intellectual sphere. Emphasizes how writers work with texts (including images, film, music, and other media) to develop writing projects. Through four main writing projects that concentrate on drafting, peer review, and revision, students learn to be constructive readers of each other's writing and to understand the rhetoric of intellectual inquiry.

Fundamentals of Speech Communication at Emerson College

Introduces basic concepts, theories, and principles of oral communication applied to speaking situations. Develops competence in oral communication through performance and critical analysis of student skills in a variety of speaking formats. Audience analysis, content discovery, communication strategies, arrangement of ideas, use of evidence and reasoning to support claims, language and style, voice and other delivery skills and ethical considerations are covered.

CC100-19 Monday and Wednesday 4:00 - 5:45 PM CC100-21 Tuesday and Thursday 6:00 - 7:45 PM

Perspectives in World Theatre at Emerson College

Looks at theatre and performance as an essential component and expression of culture. Surveys material in select time periods and global settings to demonstrate how the various elements of theatre work to reflect and shape culture on issues such as nationality, ethnicity, race, religion, gender, sexuality, class, and age. In order to do so, this course examines the roles and practices of directors, designers, dramaturges, and playwrights throughout the world from the classical to the postmodern period, and of varying theatrical styles. Readings include plays and historical material, as well as dramatic theory and criticism. Students attend lectures, participate in group work, view theatrical performances and videos, and talk to professionals in the field.

TH203-01 Monday and Wednesday 4:00 - 5:45 PM

<u>Listening to Music at Emerson College</u>

Intended for students with little or no experience in music who want to develop their listening skills and musical understanding. Emphasis is on a non-theoretical study of the elements and compositional principles of music, and careful listening to selected works of master composers in the context of a brief survey of classical music in its historical and social context.

MU137-01 Monday and Wednesday 4:00 - 5:45 PM

Perspectives in World Music at Emerson College

Investigates music-making within a variety of cultures, including societies from Africa, the Caribbean, India, the Far East, and Native Americans. Musical experience is examined from both the sonic and social perspectives, including musical form, instruments, and style, as well as music's role as a vehicle for defining and representing social values.

MU203-02 Tuesday and Thursday 4:00 - 5:45 PM

Theatre into Film at Emerson College

Explores the artistic languages of theatre and film. Dramatic material written for the stage is read and analyzed and the process of adaptation of that material is explored. Texts include the works of such playwrights as Shakespeare, Strindberg, Williams, and Albee. Film texts include the work of directors such as Lumet, Cukor, Solberg, and Nichols.

TH204-02 Tuesday and Thursday 4:00 - 5:45 PM

Introduction to Painting at Massachusetts College of Art and Design

Form, space, and light are explored through the fundamental techniques of oil and acrylic painting. The core of this course is the practice and study of color and composition. 2DPA-100 Tuesday 6:30 - 10:00PM

Drawing: Study & Practice at Massachusetts College of Art and Design

2DPA-122-01 Saturday 9:00AM - 1:30PM

Life Drawing at Massachusetts College of Art and Design

This course allows for more advanced study of the human figure from an observational perspective. Study takes place within the context of Life Drawing 102 and its emphasis on expression, pictorial space, form and light.

2DPA-202-01 Thursday 6:30 - 10:00PM

Anatomy for Life Drawing at Massachusetts College of Art and Design

2DPA-259-01 Tuesday 6:30 - 10:00 PM

Beginning Etching at Massachusetts College of Art and Design

A presentation of basic intaglio skills: drypoint, hard and soft ground etching, and aquatint. Emphasis is on using the craft and the process of printmaking to explore the more familiar ideas of line, value, and form.

2DPM-260-01 Tuesday 6:30 - 10:00 PM

Silkscreen Printing at Massachusetts College of Art and Design

An introduction to various processes in screen printing. Study of color, design, and drawing using techniques from handcut through photographic or digital stencil making.

2DPM-280-01 Wednesday 6:30 - 10:00 PM

Tableware at Massachusetts College of Art and Design

Design and fabricate individualized place settings, serving dishes, teapots, and vases. Employing hand-building, the potter's wheel, plaster molds, and various kiln-firing techniques (stoneware, soda, low-fire) students are able to create pottery that is useful as well as personally expressive. Frequent demonstrations, lectures, and dialogue with the instructor enable beginners as well as experienced workers to expand their vision and portfolio.

3DCR-226-01 Thursday 6:30 - 10:00 PM

Beginning Jewelry at Massachusetts College of Art and Design

An introduction to basic issues and techniques unique to jewelry as a creative and expressive medium. Students discuss traditional and contemporary attitudes toward body adornment and learn the techniques of basic fabrication (cold-joining, sawing, soldering, finishing), lost-wax casting, and stone-setting. Projects use precious metals and common materials. Proper use and maintenance of all equipment is stressed.

3DML-100-01 Monday 6:30 - 10:00 PM

Foundry Process in Sculpture at Massachusetts College of Art and Design

An introduction to the foundry process. Students make bronze and aluminum castings using processes of greensand and lost-wax ceramic shell casting. Course covers mold-making, casting, and chasing. Emphasis is on personal expression and technical proficiency. Proper use and maintenance of all tools is stressed.

3DSC-201-01 Thursday 6:30 - 10:00 PM

Metalshop I at Massachusetts College of Art and Design

Students in Metalshop I will focus on engaging with MIG welding, and ancillary metalshop tools such as, but not limited to: bandsaws, sanders, shears, rolls, drill presses, etc. The course focuses on craft, with an emphasis on safety and studio practice and community.

3DSC-234-01 Wednesday 6:30 - 10:00 PM

Introduction to Animation at Massachusetts College of Art and Design

An introduction to the fundamental principles of expression through movement in time, sequential composition, editing, and integration of image sequences and sound. A series of short projects will apply basic animation principles. Presentations and projects involve simple phenomena of cycles, transformations, transitions, sequential structure and the expression of emotional and kinetic states. The use of digital still and video cameras is introduced, as well as sound integration, editing and story structure using current digital software combined with traditional techniques. Character Animation at Massachusetts College of Art and Design

Leaping directly to animating 3DCG characters by utilizing pre-existing rigs, the goal is to create realistic performances that are applicable to all forms of animation. Topics like workflow, staging, acting choices, dialogue and more are explored. Work will primarily be completed using Autodesk Maya.
